INTRODUCTION

This presentation outlines the proposed fee schedule for services, supplies, and procedures provided by the East Boise County EMS District (EBCED). The purpose of this hearing is to ensure transparency and provide an opportunity for public input regarding these rates, which reflect current medical supply costs, inflation, and operational sustainability.

I. Medical Supply Fee Schedule

The following is a list of commonly used medical supplies with associated costs based on current acquisition rates. These are utilized during treatment, both in transport and in non-transport (TNT) situations:

II. Procedure Charges

These fees apply to care procedures administered by EMS personnel and are billed independently of transport charges:

III. Transport and Non-Transport Charges

The following fee schedule outlines charges for ambulance services based on the type of care provided, transport status, mileage, and residency, with additional charges applied for non-residents and responses outside the district.

IV. Fee Structure for Mass Gathering/Standby Services

Standby event services are available with customizable options including ambulance support, first aid booths, additional personnel, supervisory staffing, and optional use of all-terrain vehicles. Services may also include administrative planning time, travel time, and minimum service duration requirements. Transported patients or those requiring advanced care will be billed individually.

V. **Administrative and Clerical Fees**

Fees may apply for certain services such as extensive public records requests, returned payments, overdue invoices, and copies of EMS or billing records, in accordance with District policy and applicable Idaho law.

This section establishes the definitions of Resident and Non-Resident for the purposes of determining eligibility for certain services provided by the East Boise County EMS District.

V. **Out-of-District Charge**

An additional \$250.00 fee shall be applied to any transport or treatment-without-transport (TNT) provided to individuals who do not meet the criteria of a Resident.

We welcome comments and feedback from community members on the proposed rates and definitions. Our goal is to ensure the EMS District remains financially sustainable while continuing to provide high-quality emergency medical services to all who rely on us.

Appendix D: Fee Structure for Mass Gathering/Standby Services

- Two-person standby service with medically equipped Ambulance or Medical supplies for First Aid Booth for \$125/hour.
Note, if patients require transport or more advanced care, they will be billed individually.
- First Aid shade tent with table and chairs \$50.00 day rate
- Each Additional EMT Personnel \$60 /hour
- Supervisor(s) \$80/hour. One Supervisor will be required when 4 to 11 crew members are scheduled for a standby event.
- Two Supervisors will be required when 12 or more crew members are scheduled for a standby event.
- All-Terrain Vehicles \$250 per day of an event (only if available)
- ATV charge will be in addition to the hourly rate for the personnel
- Times of service will include a minimum of one hour of total travel time for events outside of Idaho City.
- Administrative fee for all planning or preparation time, unless otherwise agreed upon prior to the standby.
- The minimum duration for a standby is three hours.



Appendix E: Administrative and Clerical Fees

1. Public Records Requests (In accordance with Idaho Code § 74-102)
 - First 2 hours of labor and 100 pages: Free
 - Additional labor: Actual District cost \$19.00 per hour
 - Photocopies: e.g., \$0.25 per page after 100 pages
 - Electronic media (e.g., USB, CD): Actual District cost
 - Postage or delivery: Actual District cost
 - Legal review (when needed): Actual cost of attorney time (\$210.00 per hour)
 - Certification of Records \$1.00 per certification

2. Returned Check/NSF Fee
 - \$35 per returned item

3. Late Payment or Collections Fee
 - Interest or flat fee for overdue invoices
 - Collection agency fee- 33% of the payment due

4. Billing Records / EMS Report Copies
 - For patients or authorized representatives (may overlap with public records)

5. Credit Payments fee
 - \$5.00 Credit Card Convenience Fee



Appendix F: Residency Definitions

This section establishes the definitions of **Resident** and **Non-Resident** for the purposes of determining eligibility for certain services provided by the East Boise County EMS District.

- I. **Resident** shall be defined as any individual who meets one or more of the following criteria:
 - The individual pays property tax on real property located within the geographic boundaries of the East Boise County EMS District; or
 - The individual maintains a legal residence within the District and pays rent on such property; and
 - The individual includes as part of their household any legal dependents, as defined by the United States Internal Revenue Service (IRS), who also reside at the same address.

- II. **Non-Resident** shall be defined as any individual who:
 - Does not pay property tax on real property located within the East Boise County EMS District; and
 - Does not rent or reside within the boundaries of the District; and
 - Is not claimed as a legal dependent (as defined by the IRS) of an individual meeting the definition of a Resident.

Verification of residency status may be required. Acceptable documentation may include, but is not limited to, a property tax statement, lease agreement, utility bill, or other official documents demonstrating residence within the District.

Out-of-District Charge/ Non-Resident Fee:

\$250.00 per transport or Treat-Non-transport (TNT) service for Non-Residents shall be added.
